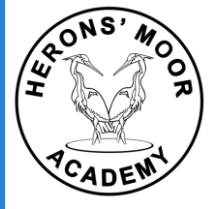

Dear Parent/Carer

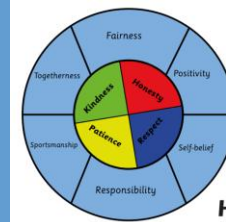
