#### **Attendance**

The school gates and doors to the building (Yrs Rec to Y6) shut at 8.50. After this, access to the building is through main reception only.

As soon as the gates open (8.40), learning activities are available in classrooms. If your child is in class just after 8.40, they will benefit from an extra hour and quarter learning each week, which equates to almost fifty extra hours across the year! "Be early and get extra learning".

#### **Nursery Applications**

We have places in our excellent Nursery for September 2024. If you have a child who has their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday before September 2024 or know somebody who is looking for a Nursery place, please collect and complete an application form which is available from the school front office, alternatively we can email the forms to you, just call us on 01934 441901.

All children are entitled to **15 hours FREE** childcare and education starting the term after their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday.

In addition, some children may also be entitled to **30 hours FREE** childcare and education depending on their circumstances (see gov.uk). Our Nursery offers **flexible sessions**- children could start as early as **8am** and finish at **3.30pm**. We provide water, milk and fruit daily and we also offer **hot meals** for children.

The Nursery is part of our successful Foundation Stage where children thrive by learning through play.

# Are you interested in training to become a primary school teacher?

Our school is part of a growing number of schools leading the way in school-led teacher training. This is really important to us because it means we can choose the very best talent and develop them into first-rate teachers. Being able to choose who we train as teachers helps us in delivering the best outcomes for pupils in North Somerset.

Herons' Moor Academy is working in collaboration with five other North Somerset primary schools with Somerset SCITT as our accredited partner, and we are recruiting another group of trainee teachers to work in our School Direct consortium from September 2022. We would be very interested in hearing from anybody who is thinking of becoming a teacher. Eligible people need to have a degree, have a passion for teaching and education and the commitment and determination to undertake an intensive year of training, 90% of which is school-based.

If you are interested, the first step is to have a conversation with me as Principal. I will be able to tell you more about this exciting teacher training opportunity.
