If you would like to talk online, just click the link and wait in the lobby until the teacher opens the session. Cameras are optional! Nursery and Reception places 2023

We are able to offer open tours of the Academy for parents who are considering sending their children to Nursery or Reception next September 2023. Please contact us for times/dates available by phoning the front office or email.

We have also made virtual tours of the school, the Reception classes and the Nursery which can be found on the Herons' Moor website.

<u>Reception Intake September 2023 (for children born between 1st September 2018 – 31st</u> <u>August 2019)</u>

From 1st September you may apply for a Reception place for your child if your child was born between the dates above. Applications may be made online at **www.n-somerset.gov.uk** or you may obtain an application pack from the School Admissions and Transport Team at the Town Hall on 01275 888328. Please note that packs are not available from the school. The closing date for the first round of allocations is at midnight on 15th January 2023.

Please remember that if your child attends our Nursery, this sadly **DOES NOT** guarantee them a place in Reception, you need to apply for a place in the same manner as all other parents. If you have any questions concerning this procedure please ask a member of staff or contact the Town Hall.

Secondary School Transfer Forms

All Year 6 children were given a letter to take home to their parents on their return to school, regarding applying for a secondary place.

The online application system will be available until Midnight (23:59 hours 31st October 2022)



Academy Spaces

We are filling up rapidly, which is great news. Our remaining spaces are in Reception, Y3, Y5 and Y6. If you know anyone who is looking for a place for their child, we would be pleased to show them around Herons' Moor.

Reporting your child's absence

Illness

Children should attend the academy every day we are open, unless they are very ill. Minor ailments should not be a reason for staying at home. If your child attends the academy when feeling slightly under the weather, but feels worse during the day, they can let a member of staff know and we will contact you to let you know if we think your child needs to go home.

If you aren't sure whether or not to send your child in, please contact us via telephone, email or in person and we will be happy to support and advise where appropriate. If your child is too ill to attend, you must notify the academy before 9.00 am on the first day of absence. If your child is ill for more than one day, you will need to notify the academy on each morning of the absence, unless otherwise agreed.

To report an absence, contact us via phone or parentmail. Please clearly explain the symptoms your child has, when the symptoms started, and when you expect your child to be well enough to return.

By law, we must record all absences and whether the absence is authorised or unauthorised.

Medical/Dental Appointments

Please try to avoid medical and dental appointments in academy time. If this is unavoidable, arrange appointments so that the minimum time is lost. Unless it is an emergency appointment, parents/carers are expected to let the academy know about the appointment in advance. You should also provide evidence of the appointment, such as an appointment letter or card. Your child should still attend school for as much of the school day as possible.

Parentmail

Please could we ask that you register and verify your account as soon as possible so that we are able to keep you up to date with information from the school. Even if we have your e-mail or mobile number we will not be able to reach you via Parentmail unless you have verified. To register, you will need to go to pmx.parentmail.co.uk (this must be done initially on a pc via google chrome, not on a mobile phone). The app can be downloaded once you have registered and verified.

Birthday Treats

Please can everyone remember that if birthday treats come into school to share, they cannot have nuts in.

Contact Information



Could we please take this opportunity to remind you that if the contact information for your child changes, i.e. telephone number, email address or home address, that you please inform the school Front Office as soon as possible. If we need to contact you, we need to ensure we have the most up to date information. Once you have informed us, we will update your ParentMail account.

Adventure Playground

Pease can we remind you for safety reasons, children are not allowed on the adventure playground or the climbing frame after school.

<u>Parking</u>

Please can parents/carers be reminded that the 3 disabled bays in the car park are for blue badge holders only, they are not to be used when dropping off or picking up children. Also, please be aware of the zebra crossing outside the front office, this can sometimes be difficult to see when mini buses are parked outside the school, remember to drive slowly when passing the school entrance.

Dear Headteacher,

Christmas Appeal for Ukraine

We hope our message finds you well, having spent a restful summer break.

Councillor Brenda Massey and I are now writing to you on behalf of our UK Registered Charity, From Bristol with Love, with the hope that your school, staff and pupils might want to join our humanitarian work.

Our small community-based charity pre-dates the war in Ukraine, but in February 2022 shortly after Russia's brutal and unprovoked invasion, we set up a specific project designed to deliver aid and hope to the People of Ukraine: From Bristol with Love for Ukraine. By now, the initial project has grown into a fully-fledged community enlisting among our supporters Bristol City Council, several Bristol and neighbouring areas schools and churches, corporate and individual Donors and over a hundred Volunteers.

Whilst we salute the excellent work other local charities do for the Ukrainian refugees who have arrived in Bristol, our charity decided to prioritise and focus on the plight of Ukrainian children and their families who are still in Ukraine, unable to flee the war-zones.

Through all the generous support received by our Charity, we have so far delivered more than 4,000 boxes of aid (food, medical supplies, toiletries), electrical generators, an ambulance, medical equipment, wheel chairs, mobility aids, and much more. Please visit our website <u>www.frombristolwithlove.org</u> for a background of who we are, what we do and where our aid goes.

We have now started a **Christmas Appeal for Ukraine**, a campaign designed to gather Christmas presents for the children of Odessa region. We intend to send as presents, new toys and winter clothes (with tags), sweets and chocolates and new puzzles (unwrapped) for children of under 16 years old.

Deadline: 11 November 2022.

Our Volunteer Aid Collectors would be happy to pick up your school's gifts and deliver them to Bristol International Centre for Ukraine. After checking and sorting, the presents will be packed and delivered by our Volunteer Transporters across Europe, to the Romanian border with Ukraine, from where they will be collected by our Ukrainian Partners, the Regional Authority of Odessa Development Team.

We hope you will be joining us in thinking of the children of Ukraine at these terrible times for them and their families and help us bring smiles in as many Ukrainian homes as possible. Cllr Massey and I would be delighted to meet you and your assembly, give a short talk on our work and address as many questions as you may have.
