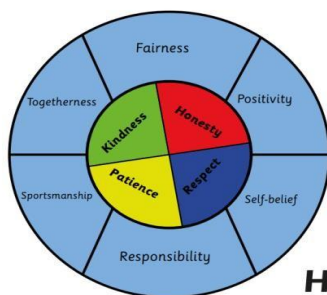

Adults and staff look for:

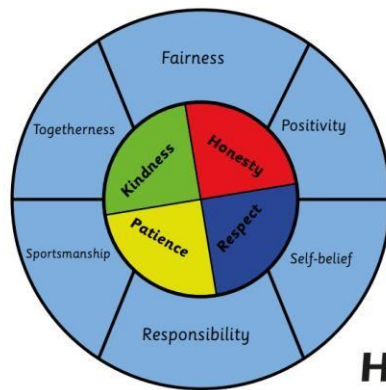
- Enthusiasm for learning

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Rewards: -

When members of staff see children behaving well in school and on the playground, behaviour is rewarded. Rewards include stickers, valued time, treats, celebration certificates as well as many other things. You can also receive effort and value marks and the house cup is awarded each term.



What happens if you don't follow the rules

If you don't follow rules there will be a consequence. This could include removal of valued time, reflection, or if more serious, suspension or exclusion. Have a look at the chart on the next page.
