# **School Council**

The school's charity this year is North Somerset Young Carers. It is estimated that approximately 2,000 young people in North Somerset have caring responsibilities at home. Young carers are young people who help look after someone who is sick, disabled, have mental health problems or have an addiction problem. They provide young carers with support and counselling and offer a number of activities including welcome groups, holiday workshops and day and weekend trips.

# Reception Intake September 2020 (for children born between 1st September 2015 – 31st August 2016)

From 1<sup>st</sup> September you may apply for a Reception place for your child if your child was born between the dates above. Applications may be made online at <a href="https://www.n-somerset.gov.uk">www.n-somerset.gov.uk</a> or you may obtain an application pack from the School Admissions and Transport Team at the Town Hall on 01275 888328. Please note that packs are not available from the school. The closing date for the first round of allocations is at midnight on 15<sup>th</sup> January 2020.



Please remember that if your child attends our Nursery, this sadly **DOES NOT** guarantee them a place in Reception, you need to apply for a place in the same manner as all other parents. If you have any questions concerning this procedure please ask a member of staff or contact the Town Hall.
